

Airway Scribes

These tools feature the original famous Airway quality design and construction—a heavy die cast housing, with a sturdy precision fitting plated steel bar. The No. 11-A Scribe has an extra needle hole in the housing for circle scribing and inlaying feature strips in a solid field. Both Scribes are supplied with a No. 21N Scribe Needle.

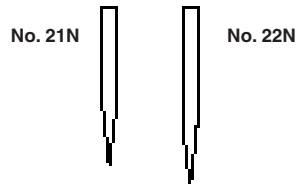


No. 111-A — 6" Airway Bar Scribe

No. 21N — 3/4" long x .068" Scribe Needle, 50/pkg

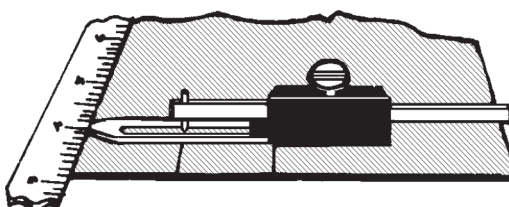
No. 22N — 7/8" long x .068" Scribe Needle, 50/pkg

How to use your Airway Scribe



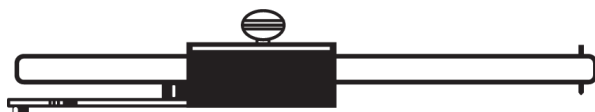
For seam cutting

Set needle to inside of guide so that needle will coincide with the underlapping edge. Score lightly. Do not crowd tool or force needle too deep as this will cause imperfect fit. Cut with slight bevel.



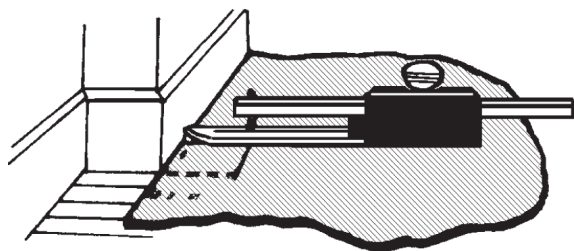
For inlaying feature strips in solid field (No. 11-A only)

Place one needle in housing and adjust bar needle to project through slot in guide. Space needles to desired width of feature strip. Score and cut with slight under bevel which makes a perfect fit.

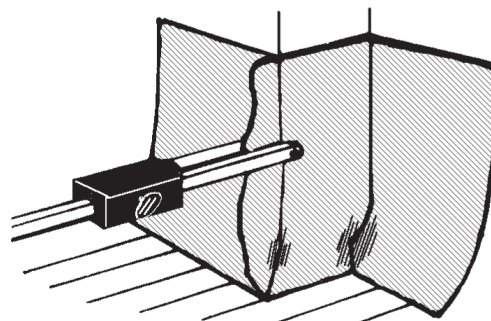


For wide scribing

Reverse bar for scribing where tight fit is required such as bath tubs, marble or wood bases.

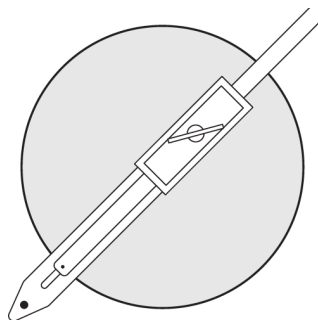


For Irregular scribing



For outside corners on cove base

To score first piece, adjust needle back from end of guide to thickness of material. Score from top of cover strip to top of floor, then cut with knife following score at a 45° bevel. To score second piece, set needle with end of guide. Score and cut again at a 45° bevel. Rub chalk in score line to make more visible.



Scoring for Circles (No. 11-A only)

Place needle in hole in housing to act as pivot. Adjust bar to desired radius. For larger circles, use No. 18-SB, 18" Scribing Bar.
